Two unforgettable characters —

Both were residents of Greensboro and lived there for many years. They were leaders in their chosen vocation and were loved and respected by thousands of friends who knew them.

Hoyt Boone was one and Murphy Williams was the other.

Hoyt Boone was a Realtor, President of Richardson Realty Co., a real estate and investment firm owned by Smith Richardson of the Vick Chemical Co., now a division of Richardson-Merrell, Inc. of New York.

Murphy Williams was a Presbyterian Preacher, and for many years was the Pastor of the Church of the Covenant.
